ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURE

Management Committee

CWBSA's Management Committee continues to provide oversight and strategic decision making for our organisation. The Management Committee operates legally as a Board of Directors under the Department of Social Services in South Africa. We have 4 permanent members and 2 artist representatives who are voted upon each year by artists who have participated in previous projects.

Staff

Our staff continues to be Jamie Lachman as Executive Director and Lulu Ngcobo as Programmes Manager. We also have taken on an intern from Reunion and plan on using interns to help with project management and administration until we can afford to hire a full-time administrator.

Facilitating Artists

Our intervention methodology requires a high level of understanding and expertise from facilitating artists when working with populations affected by crisis. In December 2009, CWBSA received a substantial grant from the Canadian International Development Agency to implement an internal capacity building project called Project Siyazisiza "Helping Ourselves". This project will expand our core staff of facilitating artists and create artistic centres in Cape Town, Johannesburg, and Durban. They will receive training in gender sensitivity, psychosocial issues, children's rights, first-aid, and the pedagogical methods that we use in the field.

As a result, we now have a core staff of 9 facilitating artists and a larger community of over 80 artists who can potentially participate in CWBSA projects.

Note on CWBSA and Volunteerism:

CWBSA does NOT work as a volunteer organisation. Volunteerism in the developing world context is seen as a poor ethical practice and exploitative of labor. As a result, from our inception, CWBSA has regarded participating South African artists as *employees* who sign contracts for projects and are registered under the South African Revenue Service (SARS). We believe that it is integral in our mission and objectives to economically empower South Africans as facilitating artists professionally and artistically to do the work of Clowns Without Borders.

When partnering with other CWB chapters or likeminded organisations, CWBSA adheres to our partner's policies regarding participation. As a result, visiting artists are generally treated as volunteers unless they are working for more than a month in the field.

- 1. To improve the psychosocial wellbeing of children and communities affected by crisis in Southern Africa and around the world through laughter and play.
- 2. To raise the awareness domestically and internationally about conditions encountered in areas of crisis.
- 3. To provide professional development and empowerment opportunities to local artists to create self-supporting and sustainable community structures.
- 4. To maintain a spirit of creativity, play, humour, joy, peace, compassion, and loving kindness in all our endeavours.
